### Plans of Safe Care


- Ensure the safety and well-being of an infant who has been affected by substance use.
- Include services and supports for both the infant and their mother and other caregivers.
- Required in both federal and state legislation.



# Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (2016)

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 After 2016, "illegal" removed and family/caregivers added to Plans of Safe Care



#### **CARA** required:

1.Health care providers "notify the child protective services systems"...

#### **AND**

2. Development of a plan of safe care for the infant and affected family member or caregiver



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### Act 54 of 2018

Act 54 amended the PA Child Protective Services Law (CPSL) to comply with the CAPTA changes.



Reworks CPSL's Section 6386 to shift from "mandatory reporting" to "notification"

Notification is for purpose of "assessing" a child and the child's family for a Plan of Safe Care

Requires PA DHS to collaborate with Department of Health and PA Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs on "written protocols"

# Steps to Developing Plan of Safe Care

Identify Infant & Mother

Notify ChildLine

Convene Multidisciplinary Team Develop and Implement Plan of Safe Care Supports for Infant and Mother/Caregiver/ Family



# Plans of Safe Care are for:

- Infants (up to 1 year of age) affected by substance use or withdrawal symptoms from prenatal drug exposure, or a Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder and
- Their families and/or caregivers with substance use disorders



### Substance Affected Infant Notification

Mandated reporter types who may make Substance Affected Infant notifications to ChildLine include:

- A person licensed or certified to practice in any healthrelated field
- An employee of a health care facility or provider licensed by the Department of Health
- An emergency medical services provider certified by the Department of Health



### Notification

# The information reported Childline by the health care provider ...

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does not indicate observable threat to the safety of the child, no Present or Impending Danger, and overall Risk Factors indicate no reasonable risk of future harm. Indicates additional health or safety concerns. These concerns are sufficient to threaten the infant's opportunity for healthy growth and development.

### Effective Plans of Safe Care

- Interdisciplinary across health and social service agencies
- Comprehensive in their review of the physical, social-emotional, health, and safety needs of the infant and the parents or caregivers
- Family-focused as they assess and meet the needs of each family member, as well as overall family functioning and well-being
- **Timely** in their completion in the prenatal period or before the infant's discharge from the hospital



### Effective Plans of Safe Care

- Easily accessible to relevant agencies with the appropriate confidentiality safeguards
- Collaborative in identifying lead agencies for plan development, implementation, management, communication, and data submission
- Evidence-informed, taking into account practices backed by research, such as a preference that infants, mothers and families remain together whenever possible

# Data Elements Reported:

- Number of infants identified as being affected
- Number of infants for whom a Plan of Safe Care was developed; and
- Number of infants for whom referrals were made
