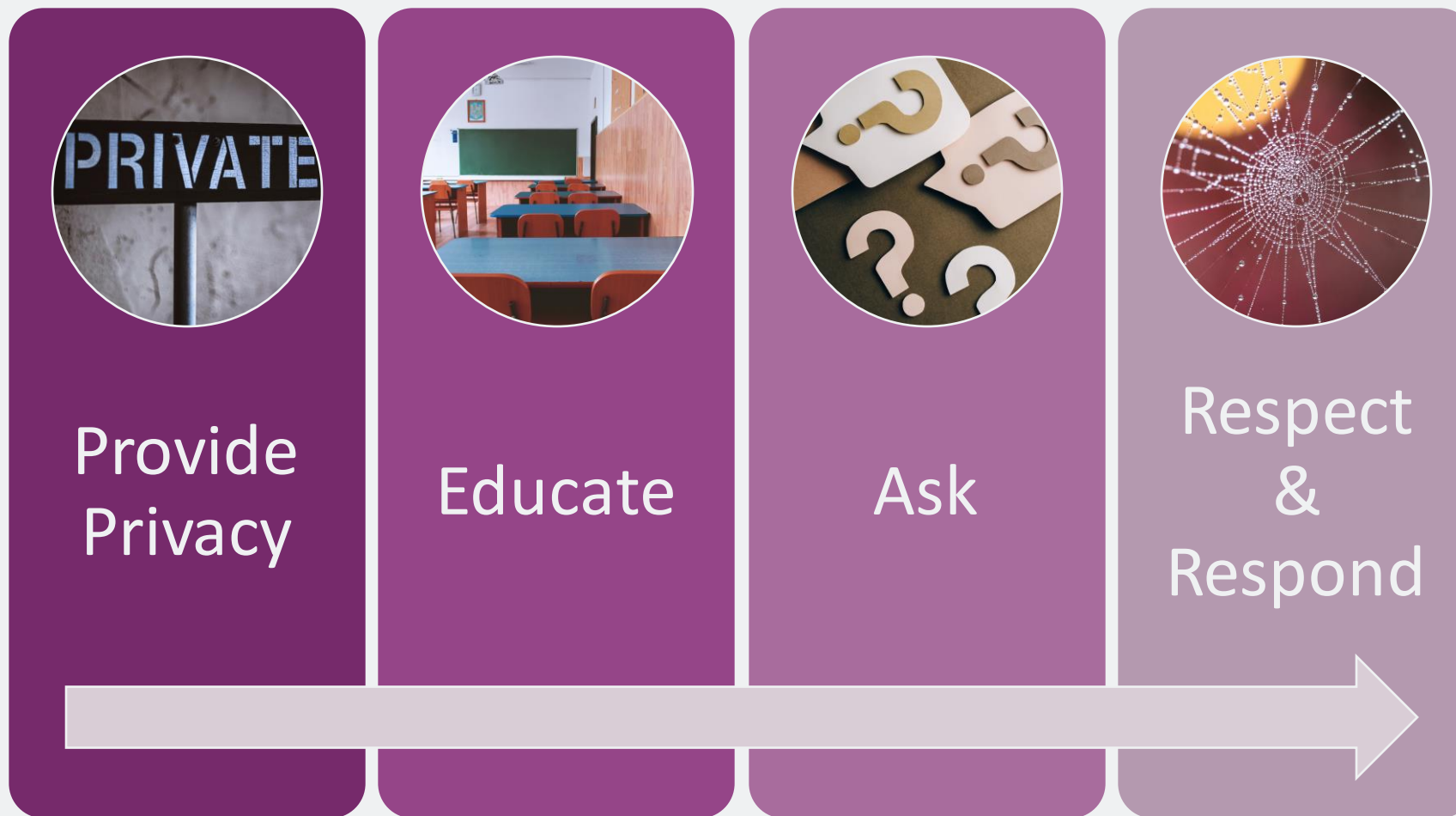
Birthing people are individuals seeking prenatal or perinatal care.



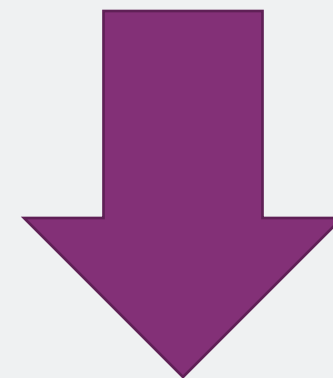
