Pregnancy-Associated Deaths in PA





Figure 9. Distribution of Pregnancy-Aassociated Deaths by Time Between Pregnancy and Death in Pennsylvania, 2013 – 2018 (N=536)




Figure 1: Pregnancy-Associated Mortality Ratio (PAMR), by Demographics, Pennsylvania 2018




